The Director of Music and Sound Production Program provides leadership for Interlochen programs in music production/technology, including the major for Interlochen Arts Academy as well as courses available to non-majors; programs offered at Interlochen Arts Camp and programs offered at Interlochen College for Creative Arts. The Director leads all faculty teaching; reviews and oversees curriculum; recommends curriculum revisions, as appropriate; and ensures student learning and student success. The Director also leads and manages a program of visiting artists. The Director is a member of institutional committees, as appropriate. The Director teaches courses, as needed and appropriate; and the Director advises students in the program, ensuring their success and completion.

The Director would also lead a student recording/apprenticeship program that enables a cadre of students to record senior recitals, performances and more, institutionalizing these recording practices for all appropriate Interlochen students.

The Director works collaboratively with Interlochen colleagues to ensure the highest educational standards.

- Manage a student recording/apprenticeship program that enables a cadre of students to record senior recitals, performances, and more
- Collaborate on programs for faculty development
- Ensure consistency and compliance in terms of policies, procedures, curriculum, and other educational issues

- Organize visiting artists, as appropriate
- Organize student trips and exchanges, as appropriate
- Participate in institutional committees, as appropriate
