We are looking for a candidate who has experience with many brass instruments and who is excited to help build the brass studio at OSA. We have a strong preference for teachers who love programming culturally diverse repertoire. There may be a possibility to teach theory and/or foundational courses as well depending on the applicant's background. BIPOC educators are highly encouraged to apply.

**Education and Experience:**

- Bachelor's degree in music from an accredited college or university required
- At least three years of prior music teaching experience required; group courses and experience leading diverse levels from beginning to advanced is highly recommended
- Advanced musicality and technique on trumpet with strong skill/knowledge of trombone. Basic skills on additional brass also recommended.
- Advanced understanding of diverse genres and styles, including, but not limited to classical and jazz
- Experience working successfully with middle-school and high school age children
- Strong organizational skills required as well as the ability to keep weekly grades and to monitor a classroom of instrumentalists
- Strong collaborative mindset
- Teaching credential in music preferred but not required. If no credential though upon hiring candidate must enroll in CTE credential program
